The perfect grant and how to get it




Figure 1: Responses of 312 independent researchers having their research labs in Europe to the question "What would be a perfect grant application?" According to these data, the perfect grant application should consist of a 2-stage approach, the proposed research should be described within 5-10 pages and should emphasis should be on science related sections. The perfect grant should have a budget of approximately 2 million euros, a duration of about 5 years and a small number of collaborators, raging from 2-3 and not exceeding 5.

The survey was conducted by the <u>FENS-Kavli Network of Excellence</u> a young, European academy of Neuroscientists. Findings were used to provide recommendations to the European Commission for the upcoming revision of Horizon 2020. The author is the Chair of the FENS-Kavli Network and the Director of the <u>dendrites lab</u> at IMBB-FORTH in Crete, Greece. The survey was coordinated by Tim Vogels at the University of Oxford.
